### February is For the Love of Artists

Whether you are a long-time member, or have recently joined, come see some of the art that helped make the Arts Guild a constant presence in Hanover for the past 50 years. Celebrating the work of members now passed, February's For the Love of Artists show will include a reception on Saturday, February 10 from 1-3pm. This show includes work borrowed from private collections; the artwork is not for sale. The center gallery will continue to feature the work of current members throughout the month.

### Artist of the Month

February's Artist of the Month **Felicity Sidwell** started painting when she came to the US with her husband in 1971. She has been studying, taking workshops and painting ever since. In 2016 they moved from the coast of Maine to an old farmhouse just north of Gettysburg to be closer to grandchildren. She finds the rolling farmland and old barns give plenty of inspiration for paintings just as did the spectacular rocky coastline and marshes of Maine. In fact the countryside of this area is very reminiscent of the farmland in Hertfordshire, England where she grew up.



To better capture the colors of a landscape caused by the light of a particular time of day or weather effect and to give a feeling of being there, Felicity prefers to paint outside "en Plein Air," sometimes using these smaller paintings later, in the studio, to produce larger work.

Wherever she has lived Felicity has sought out other artists to paint with, she is now part of the Plein Air painters group. Each week, when weather permits they love to meet on location and set up their easels to capture the colors of the landscape on canvas.

Felicity received the "Best in Show" award in November 2017 for her painting "Tidal Marsh Evening." A striking scene of fall marsh grasses in evening sunlight with dark storm clouds approaching.

### School Students Return in March

Once again, in celebration of Youth Art Month, our galleries will be filled with the work of local middle and high school students. The 37<sup>th</sup> annual School Student Show will showcase nearly a dozen area school art programs in this very popular and well-attended exhibit. A **reception** on Sunday, March 5 from 1-3pm will be open to the public.

Gallery Closed for Spring Cleaning – In preparation for the Open Exhibit in April, the gallery and classrooms will be closed for annual cleaning, upgrades and repairs the week of March 26-31.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Open Exhibit Entry Forms Available

April will mark the 3<sup>rd</sup> Open Exhibit held by the Arts Guild. Open to both members and non-members, this exhibit will be judged for cash prizes. Entry forms are now available, at the front desk and online. Completed entry forms are due by Saturday, March 17. Artists can enter one or two pieces. Entry fees for members are \$10 per piece, for non-members \$15 per piece.

Work must be hand-delivered March 29, 30, or 31 during regular Gallery hours (work will be accepted on these days although the gallery will be closed for cleaning). For all of the details and rules see the brochure with entry form.

Judging this year's Open Exhibit is **Rob Evans**, an artist and independent curator who lives and works near Wrightsville. He received a BFA from Syracuse University in 1981 and has been awarded numerous grants including two fellowships from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, and a prestigious fellowship from the Pollock-Krasner Foundation. Evans' work can be found in more than 30 prominent public collections across the nation including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, National Gallery of Art, Corcoran Museum of Art, Library of Congress, San Francisco Art Museums, Baltimore Museum of Art and the Portland (OR) Museum.



His paintings have been featured in numerous publications and on public radio and television. His enigmatic paintings and drawings have been showcased in more than 100 solo and curated group exhibitions at museums and galleries around the world.
